SUMMER AND FALL PRE-REGISTRATION

This spring for the first time, we will pre-register students for not only the upcoming summer quarter, but the fall quarter as well. Pre-registration will begin April 23 and continue through May 6. As usual, you may register by telephone or you may register in person in the Office of Academic Assistance, Morton Hall, Room 332. Registration times will be posted on the doors of Morton Hall, Rooms 329 and 332. Additionally the registration times will be read in all graduate classes prior to the pre-registration period.

REMINDER

At the beginning of the spring quarter, 1986, the Graduate Program Advisory Committee voted to reduce the number of hours required, above the foundation, to earn a MAS degree from 36 hours to 33 hours. This committee and the Graduate Dean decided that the reduction should apply retroactively to all students who had not yet received their degree. The reduction in hours was accomplished by deleting EC 626: Managerial Economics, from the Program's core. For students who had already completed EC 626, prior to this ruling, there is, in some cases, the opportunity to use the course as a part of the option. All students who had completed their Program of Study before this ruling must see The Graduate Coordinator of Advisement to delete this course from their

CHANGES IN COURSE NUMBERS



Several of the MAS courses have been renumbered and their new numbers are beginning to appear in the timetable of classes. The old numbers and the new numbers are listed below:

Old Course Number	Course Name	New Course Number
AC/Fin 601	Introduction to Accounting	AC 601
AC/Fin 670	Managerial Finance	Fin 601
AS 637	Strategic Management	AS 698

Please note that AC 601 is a foundation course and may or may not be required of you, depending upon your undergraduate background. Finance 60 is a core course and is required of all MAS students.

COURSE PREREQUISITES

Students who are required to complete MSC 608: Quantitative Methods I and EC 310: Introduction to the Use of Mathematics in Business, as part of their foundation, should be sure that they have the necessary prerequisites for each course. MSC 287: Basic Statistics is the prerequisite for MSC 608 and college algebra is the prerequisite for EC 310. If it has been some time since you completed the prerequisites, you may want to consider auditing or "listening" to them before attempting MSC 608 and/or EC 310.

PROGRAM OF STUDY

If you have completed 12 hours of graduate classes, now is the time to file your Program of Study in the Office of Academic Assistance, Morton Hall, Room 332.

APPLICATION FOR GRADUATION

Students planning to graduate in the near future should file an Application for Graduation through the Records Office in the University Center. The graduate catalogue states that this should be done 3 months prior to graduation.
