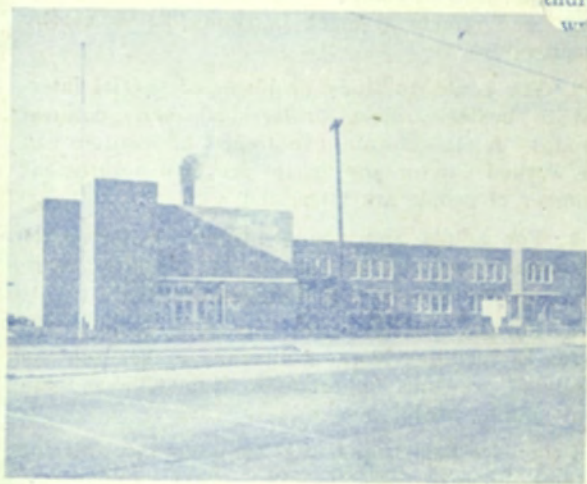

GENERAL INFORMATION

By coming to the University Center in Huntsville it is possible:

1. For students unable to attend college on a full-time basis to complete two full years of college work and remain at home in Huntsville or nearby communities.

2. For adults to study problems of special interest to business, civic, professional, and cultural groups. A class, forum, conference, or institute can be worked out for any group, provided a sufficient number of people are interested.

3. For adults and young people, regardless of previous education, to continue to develop themselves, both personally and professionally.

4. For the agencies of the community to bring the research facilities of the University to bear on the study of problems important to Huntsville and the surrounding area.

Calendar—Registration for the Summer Quarter begins June 12, 1950. Classes begin Wednesday, June 14. Students enrolled during the Spring Quarter are urged to register during examination week of the Spring Quarter.

Admission Requirements—Any person 20 years of age who can give satisfactory evidence of his ability to profit from a course, even though he lacks formal entrance qualifications, may register as a student in the Center. Students working toward a degree, however, must meet high school entrance requirements before any degree is awarded by the University. Students cannot be admitted for credit in any course in English or mathematics until the specific requirements for high school English and mathematics have been met.

Transcripts—It is the responsibility of each student seeking credit to have his high school or college transcript submitted to the University Center. No registration is final and no credit can be granted until transcripts have been received.

Withdrawal—A student who drops a course without permission from the Center office will continue to be recorded as absent from class and a grade of "F" will be given in that course. A student who finds it necessary to withdraw from a class may be withdrawn only after he has submitted a written statement of the reason why he is withdrawing. If the reason is a valid, a grade of "WD" will be given the student. No student, however, may be given a grade of "WD" if he is doing unsatisfactory work at the time of his withdrawal. The date of withdrawal will be considered the date on which the written statement of reasons is received.

In case of withdrawal during the first three weeks of the quarter, one-third of the total course fees must be paid; if withdrawal is after the end of the third week but before the end of the fifth week, one-half of the total course fees must be paid; if withdrawal is after the end of the fifth week but before the end of the eighth week, three-fourths of the total course fees must be paid; if withdrawal is after the end of the eighth week, the total course fees must be paid in full. Students who have paid more than these minimum fees will be refunded an appropriate proportion of their fees.

Veterans—Veterans should have their certificates of eligibility and other necessary papers at the time of registration. Applications for certificates of eligibility should be filed with the Veterans Administration well in advance of the beginning of the term.

Credit—Courses completed in the Huntsville Center at the freshman and sophomore levels are accepted for full residence credit toward specific degrees at the University of Alabama. In general, students may obtain 96 quarter hours of credit at the University Center. This includes credits accepted from other institutions. Courses failed on the University campus may not be repeated for credit at the University Center.

Books—Books can be purchased from the University Supply Store Branch located in the West Huntsville High School.
