Join The University of Alabama in Huntsville and Alabama A&M University in welcoming Pulitzer Prize winning author Diane McWhorter, author of "Carry Me Home: Birmingham, Alabama—The Climactic Battle of the Civil Rights Revolution," as the guest speaker for the Third Annual Civil Rights Symposium. She was the recipient of the 2002 Pulitzer Prize for general nonfiction.

"Carry Me Home," a 600-page masterpiece, took 19 years to write and was McWhorter's first book. She graduated from Wellesley College with a bachelor's degree in Comparative Literature. McWhorter will address the Civil Rights Movement in Alabama Symposium during two talks on March 10 at UAH and Alabama A&M

- She has written on race, politics and myriad topics for a variety of publications, including Harper's, The New Republic, The Nation, The Wall Street Journal, Newsday, The Washington Post and People Magazine.
- McWhorter was a finalist for the Helen Bernstein Award for Excellence in Journalism, Robert Kennedy Book Award and
- McWhorter is the recipient of the J. Anthony Lukas Prize Project, Washington Monthly's Best 2001 Political Books and the Southern Book Critics Circle Award for Nonfiction.
