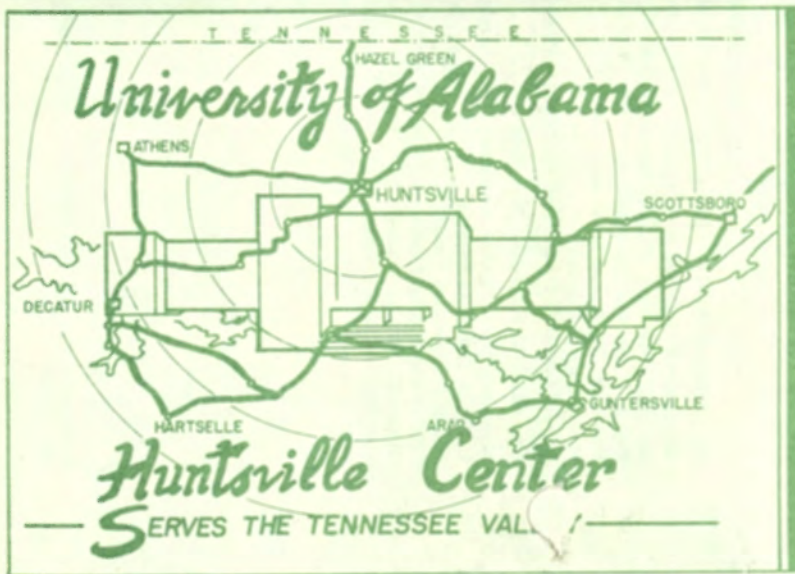

GENERAL INFORMATION

The University Center has been established to bring many of the advantages and services of the University of Alabama to persons in this area who may be unable to use the facilities at the main campus.

SERVICES

1. Regular College Courses Qualifying Students for Advanced University Standing.

The Center offers regular college credit courses leading toward college degrees in Arts and Sciences, Commerce and Business Administration and Engineering. THESE COLLEGE COURSES CARRY FULL RESIDENCE CREDIT TO ALL QUALIFIED REGISTRANTS.

2. Courses Qualifying Students for Immediate Employment.

Many students wish to take college level work which will better prepare them for employment in semi-professional capacities. Courses are offered, in sequence, as the demand appears, in the field of accounting, engineering, traffic management and secretarial administration. Students may obtain competent advice on their vocational interests at the Center from specialists in each of these fields.

3. Courses Leading Toward General Education.

The University recognized that general education is as important to the student as specialized training. A few areas which might be mentioned here are English, literature, history, political science, music, art, sociology, mathematics and physics.

4. Adult Education, Special Courses and Services

All persons in Alabama, regardless of previous education, are eligible to use the facilities of the University in preparing themselves to meet the situations which this changing society imposes upon its citizens.

Among the services not referred to above are: assistance through the Center in bringing faculty members as speakers and discussion leaders; consultative assistance to individuals, schools, business and governmental agencies; advice in selecting of University Correspondence Courses.

Groups or individuals having special educational needs should feel free to seek assistance from the University Center.

ADVANTAGES IN ATTENDING THE CENTER

1. LOCATION. The University Center, Located in Huntsville, is not far from other communities. Students from Madison, Morgan, Marshall and Jackson Counties may and do attend the Center, usually twice a week, and live at home.

2. STUDENTS MAY WORK DURING THE DAY AND ATTEND SCHOOL IN THE EVENINGS.

3. LOW COST. The cost is within the reach of everyone who has an interest in continuing his education. Two courses, the load usually carried by part time students, including books, would amount to about sixty dollars, or approximately twenty dollars per month.

4. The Center Is Designed To Meet A Wide Variety Of Conditions.

The flexibility of the program permits a person to take as little as one course or as much as a full load. The program is designed for adults as well as recent high school graduates. Special courses and other activities are offered as conditions warrant.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Practically everyone interested in continuing his education and can give satisfactory evidence of his ability to profit from work desired may register.

ACTIVITIES OF SPECIAL INTEREST

ACCOUNTING

Many students desire courses of study pointing toward definite professional training in accounting. To meet these needs the University has prepared an accounting series leading toward a certificate in accounting which is recognized throughout the area. Courses offered during the spring quarter in this series are Principles of Accounting, Advanced Accounting and Cost Accounting.

ENGINEERING AND SCIENCE AIDS

Many persons find that they need specific courses of refreshers to qualify for positions as engineering and science aids.

The University offers this quarter College Algebra, Trigonometry, Physics, Biology and other courses which prepare for these positions. More specific information may be obtained at the Center offices.

ENGINEERING DRAFTING

Engineering Drawing 31 and 32 will qualify a student for beginning level engineering drafting work. Engineering Drawing 31 is offered this spring quarter and it is suggested that interested persons contact the Center office for related courses in this area of training.

SEMINAR IN LOCAL HISTORY TO 1860

Organized as a non-credit course, this group will be open to all those interested in the ante bellum history of Huntsville and Madison County. Ten meetings will be scheduled at a time convenient to the members of the seminar. (Fee \$10.00)

POLITICAL SCIENCE

Political Science 45 - Public Administration

This course is of an introductory character and is concerned with the importance of administration in modern government, the relation of politics to administration, the principles and techniques of organization and management, and the problems resulting from the mutual impact of democracy and bureaucracy. Illustrative cases will be discussed.

ART

Courses are offered in both drawing and painting and, as demand appears, in ceramics. In these courses, students under competent direction, find opportunities for relaxation and enjoyment in seeing results of their own creative efforts.

These courses meet only once a week for four hours each night.

THEORY OF EQUATIONS

This is a new course at the University Center. Due to widespread interest and need for mathematics in this particular area, Theory of Equations is being offered this term.

It is a bridge between elementary Algebra and advanced Algebra. It includes: Polynomials, Strumm's theorem, Budan's theorem, systems of linear equations, ruler and compass constructions. It is strongly recommended for prospective Mathematics teachers.

THERMODYNAMICS (ME-109)

A continuing course in thermodynamics providing an expanded treatment of the laws of thermodynamics as related to vapors. This course will be useful to anyone wanting a broader foundation in thermodynamics or anyone who is presently concerned with problems of heat flow or gas and vapor flow.

ENGINEERING PREVIEW II (GES - 12)

The objective of this course is to train a student to easily perform engineering computations. Included will be a study of significant figures, accuracy, good form, slide rule calculations and applications of exponents, trigonometry, and basic engineering mechanics. The course would be repetition for anyone who already has proficiency in engineering computations. The course is equivalent to Engineering Analysis required for campus student, but it includes additional application studies.
