## Multimedia Lab Grand Opening: Jan 24th

### Join us for Demos, Refreshments, and Giveaways!

The M. Louis Salmon Library's Multimedia Lab fully launches operations this semester and is going to have its Grand Opening on January 24th at 2pm. You are invited to join us for the celebration. We will have giveaways, refreshments, and live demonstrations of the software and equipment. The lab and library staff will be on hand to answer questions. No RSVP is necessary, just stop on by and say hello.

What is the Multimedia Lab? It is the library's new service that allows you to design, record, and edit whatever audiovisual materials you need. You can take photos for a classroom project, set up a podcast about your favorite hobby, or use the GoPro to record your urban exploration adventures. Instructors can use the equipment to make online videos or to record key classroom lectures (or, you know, to film *their* urban exploration adventures). If you want to properly show off your (or someone else's) creations, the lab has projectors, speakers, and a PA system to cover the playback needs of any number of venues and media types.

And this is just the beginning of this new service, we are looking for feedback as to how we can expand upon it and make it better! That's another good reason to stop by and see what we have.

The Multimedia Lab is open to all students, faculty, and staff on campus. It is in the Salmon Library room 210 and is where patrons go to ask questions about media design, check out equipment, use one of our media workstations, or reserve the recording studio. Most of the equipment can be checked out for five (5) days at a time, while the green screen containing recording studio is reserved for three (3) hours. Several pieces of the equipment have optional accessories that can be obtained: tripods, GoPro mounts, microphone stands, and so forth.

### Value Line, Morningstar, PhilPapers, and more!



Also, if you have not taken a look at **Standard & Poor's NetAdvantage** for a while, they have recently redesigned their user interface to include more indepth options for searching and building data.

## Library Tips! Checking your Account Online and Renewing Books



It is now easy to check your account and renew your books online. (1) From the library homepage ([uah.edu/library](http://uah.edu/library)), click on "Catalog & My Account". (2) Your name or "logged out" should appear in the upper right-hand corner of the Primo Pathfinder screen. Either way, click it. (3) Click on "My Library Account". (4) [optional] If logged out, enter your information into the Single Sign-On page that shows up. (5) Now you have your account page where you can renew books, check fines, and see your requests.
