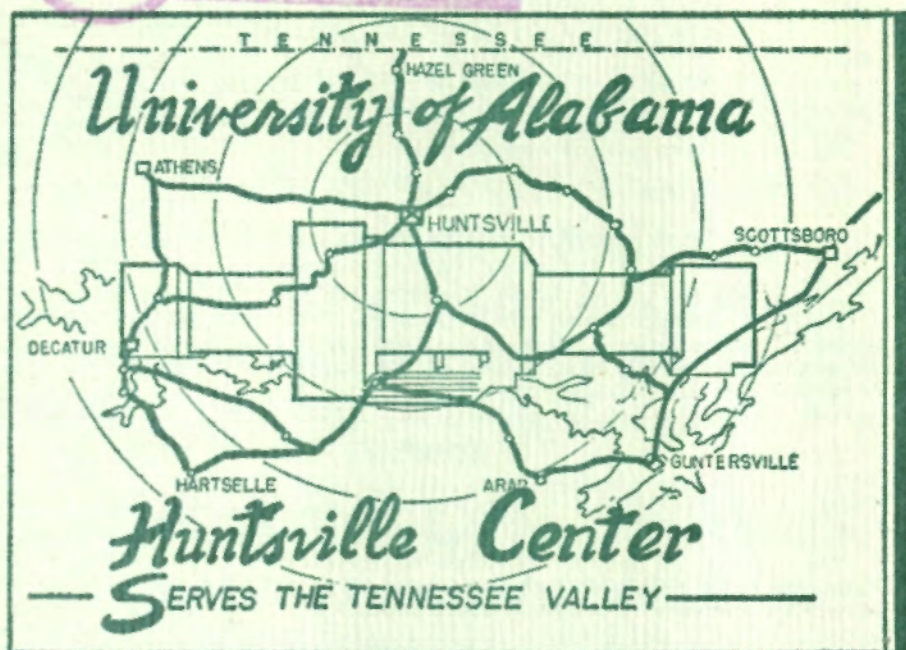

COMMERCE AND BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

The University Center offers professional training in accounting. Principles of accounting, accounting analysis and auditing are all available the spring quarter. Courses in principles of economics, marketing and business law are also offered.

THE SOCIAL SCIENCES AND LANGUAGE

Courses are offered in art (including sculpture), history, economics, psychology, sociology and political science. These classes may be taken for college credit or not for college credit as one desires. A sequence of German is currently being taught at the Center.

RUSSIAN

For those persons who would like an informal study of the Russian language, a non-credit course in Russian is now available at the Center. The evening and hour for this class will be arranged. Persons interested in this study should contact the Center office early because enrollment will be limited to a relatively small group.

THE SCIENCES AND MATHEMATICS

Biology, general chemistry and physics, with full laboratory facilities, are now available at the Huntsville Center.

It is possible to take almost any level of undergraduate mathematics one may desire at the Center. For those whose background in mathematics is weak, there are courses in elementary algebra, college algebra, trigonometry, analytic geometry, calculus and differential equations and theory of equations are currently offered.

The program in physics includes mechanics, heat, light and sound; and, for the first time, a course in modern physics.

ENGINEERING

Several courses are offered primarily for engineers. General engineering studies, engineering drawing, technical English, D.C. circuits, chemical process calculations, manufacturing processes, thermodynamics, and strength of materials are available for the spring term.

Persons registering for English 1 and Mathematics 11 for credit will be required to take entrance examinations in those fields. These examinations are given at the Center, March 26 from 6:00 o'clock to 8:30 o'clock P. M.

SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENT

Persons who have completed two years or more towards a degree in Arts and Sciences may now take additional work for full residence credit at the University Center in Huntsville. This represents a change in University policy which has become effective only this year.

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

People who wish to continue their education may usually enroll in any class from which they may profit. Certain University of Alabama requirements must be met if the registrant wishes full University of Alabama credit. Full information concerning this matter may be obtained at the Center offices.

PAYMENT OF FEES: WITHDRAWALS

All course, registration, and laboratory fees are due and payable at the time of registration. Arrangements may be made for payment of one-fourth of course and laboratory fees at the time of registration and payment of the remainder in installments during the quarter.

A student who withdraws from a course during the first 10 calendar days of the official quarter, March 25 - April 3, must have paid 20 per cent of the total course and laboratory fees; from 11 through 25 days, April 4 - 18, 40 per cent; from 26 through 45 days, April 19 - May 8, 60 per cent. A student who withdraws after 45 days must have paid his course and laboratory fees in full. Other Center fees are not subject to proration on account of withdrawal.

Students desiring to withdraw from courses must secure advance permission from the University Center office. A written request is necessary.

REFUNDS

In cases of authorized withdrawals, refunds will be made on the basis of the above schedule. Date of withdrawal will be the date on the written request which is filed with the Center office.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The University of Alabama campus covers the State. The University Center located at Huntsville has been established to help bring the services of your State University to the people of the Tennessee Valley.

WHO IS SERVED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF ALABAMA CENTER

1. Persons may earn regular college residence credit for three years in the College of Arts and Sciences, in the School of Chemistry and in the College of Engineering. Up to two years of credit may be earned in the College of Commerce and Business Administration and Education.

2. Many adults who are not particularly interested in taking courses for college credit wish to take college level work to prepare them better for work in a higher professional field. The University offers in sequence, as demands appear, many courses in engineering, accounting, mathematics, secretarial administration and others.

3. Adults who wish to increase their knowledge in some cultural or professional field for self improvement may benefit from many University Center offerings. This University program is equally attractive to persons who may have one or more degrees.

4. Adults who may have degrees but who wish to build up undergraduate credits in another field of interest may gain valuable credit at the Center. Persons lacking prerequisites for graduate studies compose one group who benefit from such courses.

While it is not always possible to determine exactly the needs of any community along educational and cultural lines, the University would always welcome suggestions from interested persons as to possible ways in which the Center may meet a community need.

If there are requests from a sufficient number of persons, and if the resources of the University permit, classes which do not appear on this schedule may be offered. Such courses need not necessarily conform to beginning and ending dates in this announcement.

The University cooperates with other agencies in the Tennessee Valley in sponsoring clinics, institutes, seminars, and short courses.

ADVANTAGES OF ATTENDING THE UNIVERSITY CENTER

An increasing number of people in the Tennessee Valley area are recognizing the advantages of the University campus covering the State of Alabama.

People are attending the Huntsville Center, usually two nights a week and they can go home each night. Persons who work during the day and attend school two evenings a week presently attend from Cullman, Madison, Marshall, Morgan, Limestone and Jackson counties.

Cost of attendance at the Center is unusually low. For a person carrying two courses, which is the maximum that a person with a full time job may usually carry, the cost is approximately \$75.00 (including books) each semester, or about \$25.00 per month.

The program of the University Center is flexible enough to permit a person to take as little as one course or as much as a full college load at the Center. This program is designed for adults or recent high school graduates.
