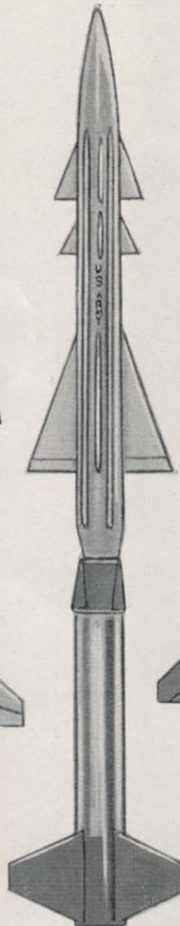

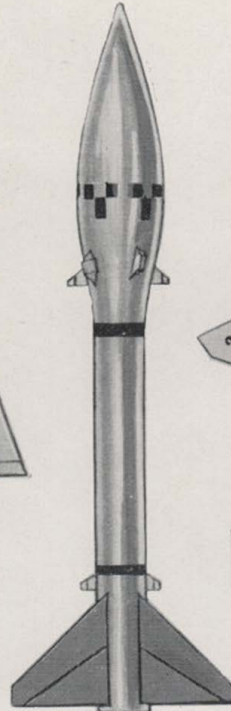

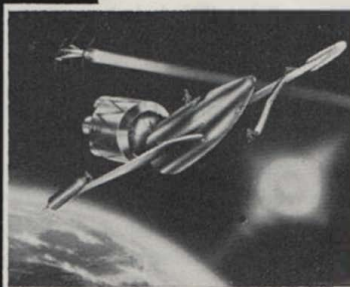

In keeping with SPACE Journal's theme of projecting into the future, Harry Lange has created an imaginative representation of an Outer Space scene envisioned by Hoepfner and Isbell in the second part of their article Project Star to appear in a forthcoming edition. The landing vehicle, shown in the foreground, is being separated from the photon (light) thrust unit and prepared for re-entry into the Earth's atmosphere. In the background, another interstellar Space ship can be seen leaving our Solar System at near light speed. Actually, the photon ray would be invisible, since its wave length would be in the X-ray and gamma-ray region, but for illustrative purposes the light ray is shown with the rainbow effect of the entire light spectra.
