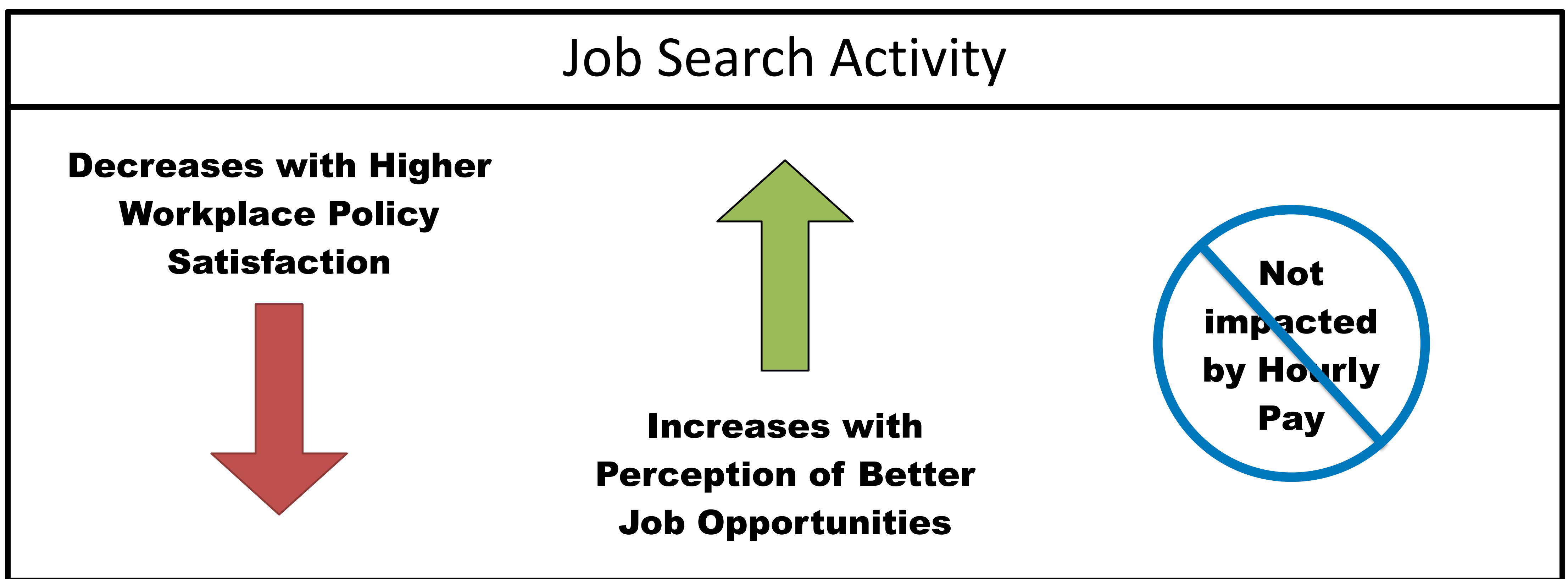


**Stuck in a Dead-End Job:
