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
Introduction

Historical Background

- Little Theater's were established across the United States in the 1920's and were based on ideas derived from European Theatre.
- Huntsville Little Theatre began in the 1950's.
- Fantasy Playhouse was founded in 1961 by an offshoot group of Huntsville Little Theater who wanted to focus on children's theater.

- Created a finding aid for the 5 boxes with Archive Space.

- Learned about the importance of preserving theater materials.
